

Campus Emergency Equipment

It should be recognized that certain extraordinary emergencies (e.g., major earthquake) of a local/regional impact can necessitate the campus to be self-sufficient and/or standing alone for a significant period of time (72 hours or more).

Included in this plan is a list of basic equipment and supplies the campus should have to facilitate the discharge of its responsibilities during any stand-alone period.

The need for equipment and supplies by the campus is predicated on the following assumptions:

- ◆ That the campus has established an Emergency Operations Center (EOC), as the central location for the management of emergencies.
- ◆ That the campus may have to “stand alone” for 72 hours or longer.
- ◆ That lifesaving/rescue operations, if appropriate, will be undertaken as quickly as possible.
- ◆ That mutual aid will be given to and/or by local agencies as available.

The kinds of equipment necessary to carry out the management of emergencies and lifesaving/rescue operations are described in the Campus Emergency Equipment Inventory and are not limited to the following sections:

- ◆ Emergency Operations Center Equipment.
- ◆ Lifesaving/Rescue Equipment.
