**CONGRATULATIONS!** We have reserved a space for you in Humboldt State University's EOP Summer Bridge Program 2009 (August 14th - 21st.)

### **What is Summer Bridge?**

**Summer Bridge is a residential program that helps new EOP students get ready to start their studies at the University. You will receive an orientation to the University and to the local community. You will also be able to meet and get to know other students, university staff and faculty.**

### **What Does it Cost to Attend?**

During the six-day Summer Bridge Program your room, meals, recreational activities, testing (English Placement Test and Entry Level Math Test), and other program activities are provided at **NO COST**. Students must pay transportation costs to Humboldt State University.

### **What Are My Living Arrangements?**

You will be living on campus in your room that you have set up with Housing. We will do our best to help with your roommate assignment, meal plan, etc. You will eat your meals in the Jolly Giant Commons (JGC) cafeteria.

### **When Does Summer Bridge Begin?**

The 2008 Summer Bridge Program will begin Friday August 15th and seamlessly blend in with Humboldt Orientation Program on the 20th, followed immediately by the Fall semester! **If you are living in the residence halls plan to arrive between 8am - 5pm on the 14<sup>th</sup> of August. The program will officially begin on the 15<sup>th</sup>, check in between 9 - 12 on Saturday the 15<sup>th</sup> at the bottom of the JGC.** Enclosed is a campus map showing the residence halls where you will live and the location of the EOP office. **If you must arrive on the 13th, EOP will not be able to provide housing.**

### **Transportation**

If you will be arriving by bus or plane, let us know your arrival time and we will have someone meet you at the bus station or airport to bring you back to campus. Horizon (Alaska Airlines) offers a discount. Call 1 (800) 547-3209 and give the following information: group ID: CMT-1274 when you make your reservations or go online and use the e-certificate of ECCMT-1274. There is a better rate if made 60 days in advance.

Do not register for the Humboldt Orientation Program (HOP). You will register for Fall classes through the Summer Bridge Program.

Dear Summer Bridgee

You most likely have a lot of things to accomplish during your last year of high school but I would like to encourage you to think about something else in preparing for Humboldt State University; math and English. Where you begin the math and English process is determined by your placement tests, which are required for most incoming freshmen.

The Education Opportunity Program (EOP) would like to strongly encourage you to take your Entry Level Math (ELM) and English Placement Test (EPT) during your second semester of your senior year. The tests are offered on every CSU campus. Contact the campus near you to register for a test.

Because your placement in math and English courses will be based on your test scores, a little test preparation can help ensure that you have the appropriate class schedule your first semester. Without such preparation you may end up being placed in a class that does not properly challenge you.

# FINANCIAL AID CHECKLIST

Things to do to complete your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Financial aid at Humboldt State University is an integral part of your education. EOP can help in many ways, most importantly, in describing the process and explaining all of the requirements and forms you will receive.

Here is a list of things for you to do (✓):

\_\_\_ Apply for a Personal Identification Number (PIN) at [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). The PIN is used as an electronic signature and is required by both you and your parent/guardian. You can apply for the PIN before January 1<sup>st</sup>!!!

\_\_\_ File as soon as possible at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). If your FAFSA is submitted after March 1<sup>st</sup> you may lose out on some forms of grants and scholarships but you will still get money for college. You **cannot** submit your FAFSA **before** January 1<sup>st</sup>. It is OK to estimate income for 2008.

\_\_\_ Provide a reliable email address or mailing address on the FAFSA.

\_\_\_ Provide HSU's federal school code on the FAFSA (**HSU = 001149**).

\_\_\_ Check the status of your submitted FAFSA on-line a week after you submit it. Call EOP if you have questions.

\_\_\_ Look for a Student Aid Report (SAR) by email.

When you receive your SAR, read it carefully and call EOP if you have any questions.

Make sure that:

\_\_\_ your application was properly signed and completed

\_\_\_ HSU is listed as one of the schools to receive your information

\_\_\_ your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) was established

\_\_\_ you know if you were selected for Verification

-Students selected for verification will be asked to provide additional documents by each school listed on the FAFSA.

**Almost all financial aid paperwork has a deadline to be completed. If you miss the deadline, it's like going to the back of the line, starting over, and you may miss out on significant amounts of money!!!**
